A Prince's Trust Youth Summit for young people of the Commonwealth on Sustainable Development

The Prince's Trust is putting together a Youth Summit focusing on Sustainable development around the commonwealth, it will be the second of three summits chosen by young people to take place between now and next April. This Education Youth Summit will be made up of three virtual sessions that will take place on Tuesday 23rd November 2021 between 10am-3pm.

We would like to invite schools from the UK and across the commonwealth to get involved with this event.

During this Youth Summit we will be exploring what sustainable development across the commonwealth look like by showcasing what is already being done and discussing where improvements could be made to obtain a sustainable future for all.

All pupils participating will take part in a social action project based on sustainable development which will benefit their school or local community. This project will be published once all schools have signed up.

Students will leave the summit with a certificate of participation and a enhanced skill set.

All the thoughts, data and showcases collected from the summit will be put together in a manifesto document which will be publish in July 2022.

We hope to inspire young people at the summit to help create a more sustainable future by making change, pledges and calls to action.

What we would need from Schools:

- Minimum of 10 students
- Teacher/staff member commitment from school
- Be willing to complete a project on Sustainable development
- Students to fill out a: pre and post evaluation and a marketing consent form
 - Students and teachers to be willing to be on screen during the event
- Attendance of full day

- Detailed briefing plan for event
 - Project plan for students
 - Activity documents
- Teacher information session led by The Prince's trust before confirmation
- Briefing session for all confirmed schools
