








CGF Africa Regional Meeting 2019

ANOCA ZONE V YOUTH GAMES 2019

From the 02nd of April 2019 to the 6th of April 2019, Rwanda through the Rwanda National Olympic and Sports Committee had successfully hosted the ANOCA ZONE V YOUTH GAMES 2019, First Edition in Huye District, Southern Province.

The 5 - day massive event was organized by the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa Zone 5, the Rwanda National Olympic and Sports Committee and the Ministry of Sports and Culture of Rwanda.

About 300 athletes from 11 countries of ANOCA ZONE V namely South Sudan, Rwanda, Burundi, Tanzania, Uganda,

Kenya, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Somalia, Sudan, and Egypt plus Refugees Olympic Team based in Rwanda and France as the invited country competed in 5 different disciplines: Taekwondo, Cycling, Beach Volleyball, 3X3 Basketball, and Athletics.

As the theme of this event was "Peace. Unity and Social Cohesion", these games were the good time to educate the youth of the zone 5 about the impact of sport in building Peace, Unity and reconciliation in the society and to join Rwanda for the 25th commemoration of the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi.

Egypt will host the 2nd edition of this bi-annual event in 2021































































































Rwanda Sports Movement built house for Nyiramariza Clothilde

In line of Kwibuka 25 and paying respect to the victims especially the sportsmen killed in 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi, on 26th May 2019, the Ministry of Sport and its affiliated institutions, Rwanda National Olympic and Sports Committee and National Sports Federations have officially inaugurated the house which was built for the vulnerable genocide survivor, Madam Nyiramaliza Clothilde. This house which is situated in Cyeza sector, Muhanga district is estimated to coast 10,000,000Frw.

The Nyarusange memorial site received a donation of 500,000Frw while 10 vulnerable families have been given cows and materials for other 10 families.

won gold medals.

171 participants from 91 countries gathered at the International Olympic Academy (IOA) in Ancient Olympia, Greece for this annual session under the theme: "Olympic Diplomacy and Peace" with special subject: "Olympic Diplomacy: How can Olympic Sports play a positive role in International Diplomacy?"

"The two week annual session, traditionally held in June or July, is designed as an introduction to Olympism and the Olympic Movement. The IOA brings together a large international group of young people who are primarily students, Olympic athletes, people active in sport, teaching or active in their respective NOCs or NOAs.

The aim of the IOA is to educate, but more importantly, to motivate young people to use their experiences and knowledge gained from the Session productively in promoting the Olympic Ideals and educating others in their own countries." (cfr. IOA Website).

The objectives of Rwanda Commonwealth Games Association for hosting this meeting were:


- Raising the prestige and respect of Rwanda in the region.

On 3rd September 2019, CGF delegates visited Kigali Genocide Memorial Site.






























Visit to Rwanda Women **Parliamentary Forum**
